Dear Friends,







Year Round Outreach Program

The goal of the Outreach program is to alleviate some of the stress and overwhelming feelings that often accompany this process and help each girl successfully complete high school and follow the educational path that helps her reach her full potential.

This year, four TSC alumni are first-year college students! All joined us this summer and are role models for our younger campers who are currently setting goals for their futures, including 17 campers who are Juniors and Seniors just beginning this transition. Logan Thompson, Assistant Director and Outreach Coordinator, offers guidance and help, working to ensure that each camper has the resources for educational success!

Summer Camp Friendships

We are excited to encourage and foster camp friendships! Each holiday season, we mail a pen-pal kit to each camper and staff. A highlight among campers and parents, each kit includes paper, postcards, pens, envelopes, stamps, stickers and samples of how to write a friendly letter and address envelopes and postcards.

Camp friendships are monumental for all campers, including those who cannot share their mailing addresses. In those cases, we include them in the pen pal kit activity and have their letters sent directly to The Summer Camp, which we then forward to the camper.

We provide an inclusive, supportive and safe environment in which campers explore fun, challenging and educational experiences, learn from positive role models, and have the opportunity to build skills for life year after year.
